

Treasures from the Collection

To coincide with our grand reopening, HSP will be displaying selected treasures from the collection. These rare and unique items span across four centuries of our nation's history, from the founding of Pennsylvania to the civil rights movement. Among the items on display will be life portraits of William and Hannah Penn, the first handwritten draft of the United States Constitution, William Still's Underground Railroad Journal, and censored correspondence from a Japanese internment camp. Because of their national significance and sensitivity to light and temperature, these documents are rarely displayed. This display—free to attend—is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to see all of these national treasures at one time.
