Elias Jasper is about 32 yrs. about dark, well featured, very gifted with his tongue and hands- had worked at the following trades- Rope making, Carpentering, Engineering, chain making, painting, Mechanist & daguerreotyping¹, at which calling he was employed when he left. For several yrs. he had been in the habit of hiring his time for which he had paid \$10. per month. In learning the above trades he was obliged to gain the insight by his own ingenuity- paying occasionally for a lesson. His Master's Bayham, a retired gentleman- had been sold once. Had suffered by various exposures, by flogging, &c. Left a wife, Mary, but no child. Was not at liberty to inform her of his scheme to leave. She is owned by the Miss Portlock's- has been used tolerable well. Pays \$55 per year, washes &c. He is a member of the Methodist Ch.² Often heard master preach of obedience to the slaves. Value \$1200
