HOW WE CHOOSE OUR PRESIDENTO-morrow the people of the United States vote for President and Vice President of the UnStates for the next presidential term of four y commencing on the 4th day of March, 1865. occasion will justify a brief review of the met by which the people express and effectuate will in this important matter.

In the Second Article of the Constitution o United States it is provided that "each State "appoint, in such manner as the Legish "thereof shall direct, a number of electors e "to the whole number of Senstors and R " sentatives to which the State may be entitle "the Congress." And in the Twelfth Artic is further provided that these "electors shall "in their respective States and vote by ballo "President and Vice President." By the article they are required to make distinct lis all persons voted for as President and Vice I dent and the number of votes for each, as sign and certify the same, and to transmit th sealed, to the Seat of Government of United States, directed to the President of Senate. The President of the Senate is directed to open said certificates in the pres of the House of Representatives, when the

shall be counted. The person having the greatest number of votes for President shall be the President, if such number be a majority of the whole number of electors appointed. If no person have such majority then from the three persons having the highest numbers the House of Representatives shall choose immediately the President. In choosing the President in the House the vote shall be taken by States, the representation from each State having one vote. A quorum for this purpose shall consist of a member or members from two-thirds of the States, and a majority of the States shall be necessary to a choice.

The person having the greatest number of votes for Vice President shall be the Vice President, if such number be a majority of the electors appointed. If no person have a majority then from the two highest numbers on the list, the Senate shall choose the Vice President, a quorum for the purpose being two-thirds of the whole number of Senators, and a majority of the whole number is

necessary to a choice.
