The Cost of Caring: Expense Book, Vigilance Committee of Philadelphia, 1854-55 PAS Papers, HSP

In 1852 the Vigilance Committee was created during a meeting of the Pennsylvania Anti-Slavery Society, with Robert Purvis, an ardent abolitionist, as head of the General Committee. The purpose of the committee was to continue the work of the Vigilant Association in assisting and protecting fugitive slaves. Considerable expenses could be incurred when assisting runaways – not only food and transportation but additional expenses such as clothing, shelter, and medicine.
