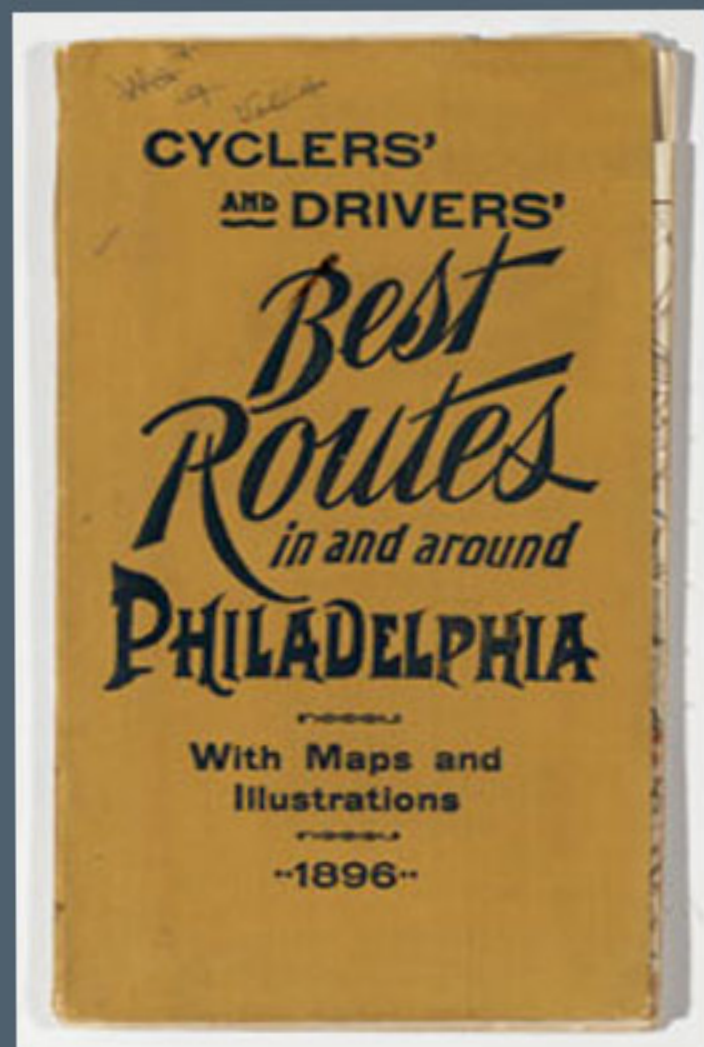

 In the matter of the bills,

 belong to Clubs, and which do not have lights, do
 not come to them. When called to
 a subject, they pay no attention whatever,
 and have to be finally stopped. Just in the case
 of one of the members (I believe) who had just
 returned from the residence at City
 they accepted him from all last night.
 On Oct 1st he had night 47 persons were
 ejected from the Park, who had no lights whatever.
 This was 42 up to yesterday morning, and yesterday
 evening there were a copy of bills.

 Critical Injuries at GEAR
 by Tim Carey
 Joan Koper, a participant in BCP activities since last
 October, and in January, has sustained a life
 threatening brain injury from a bicyclist accident while
 attending GEAR '01 in Washington, VA, early Saturday
 morning June 1, 1901.
 I had encouraged many of the first members of our club
 who were there at Wilson and Mary College, to get up
 early Saturday for the pre-breakfast ride. Joan was made
 sure I was up at 5:00 am so I would's miss the fun part.
 As we slowly rolled out of the state staging area, over one
 hundred high-speed cyclists, among, one of the BCP
 members Eric Steiner, remarked to Joan, "Where is your
 helmet?" Joan replied, "It's a long story" Her long story
 turned out to be that she mistakenly left it home in her
 trunk to have I had to report "Joan was the only one
 at this event without a helmet! Oh well."
 Not being a fan, Joan did not go to the end of the
 group. Betty Lamb, Joan's sister, asked me for my cue
 sheet, for she had dropped hers. She said, "I've got about
 178 ride in the back of the pack with Joan. That's what we
 came here for, to ride together."
 Riding into the early morning with the sun rising in front
 of us, Joan and Betty were doing everything right, when a
 car came from behind and was blinded by the sun. The car
 hit Joan, knocking her to the roadway. She sustained a head
 injury without the protection of her helmet. Joan was deliv-
 ered to Sentara, Norfolk General Hospital and emergency
 surgery was necessary. Joan is in very serious
 condition.
 As of this writing, Joan 17, Joan has been transferred out
 of intensive care into a step down unit, and has responded
 to commands. Her neck brace has been removed also. She
 continues to spike fevers. She is expected to be flown back
 to Philadelphia this Tuesday for continued hospitalization at
 the Medical College of Pennsylvania where Joan's sister
 Betty works as a nurse.
 Findings of hope and love, along with wishes of health and
 encouragement are sent to Joan and Betty, and those that
 love them, from their friends and family of Bicycle Club of
 Philadelphia.
