

Dilworth Fellowship

Each year the Historical Society of Pennsylvania awards one Richardson Dilworth Fellowship for Law, Politics, and Reform. The fellowship supports one month of residency in Philadelphia for advanced, postdoctoral, and dissertation research on legal or political history topics, or on the history of reform movements. The stipend is \$2,000. The Library Company's Cassatt House fellows' residence ^[1] offers rooms at reasonable rates, along with a kitchen, common room, and offices with internet access, available to resident and nonresident fellows at all hours.

The Richardson Dilworth Fellowship program began in 2015–2016 academic year and is endowed by Dilworth Paxson LLP.
