Introudcution

James Kenny meticulously kept a ledger book of the trades between the Indians and the back settlers at Fort Augusta. In general, the settlers traded manufacturing products such as textiles and metal objects that the Indians needed, but which otherwise were unavailable to them. The Indians, on the other hand, furnished the settlers with animal furs and agricultural products. His ledger book contains a record of this mutually beneficial trade between the two groups from May 6th until August 10th of 1763 in the vicinity of present day Sunbury, Pennsylvania.
