

Know, all men, by these presents that I Marie Rose Louis of the City of Philadelphia in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania late from the French West Indies, of my own free will and accord and from motives of humanity and benevolence, have manumitted and set free from slavery, and hereby do manumit and set free from slavery my female negro slave named Fanny, aged about fifteen years, reserving only to myself and my Assigns her services and labour for and during the term of fifteen years; for which purpose Inventures are to be executed between me and the said Fanny to bear date the day after the date hereof, whereby the said Fanny is to bind herself to serve me or my Assigns during the said term of fifteen years thence next ensuing. And I do hereby for myself, my Heirs, Executors and Administrators give, grant, release and relinquish unto the said Fanny all my property, right and title in and to her person and services and in and to the property and estate which she may hereafter acquire, excepting only her services during the term aforesaid.
