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Abstract

Papers for James Clark Moore and William Colmer Moore include early surveys of Pennsylvania lands including the first draft of a survey for Germantown, and cashbook for Richard Peters, 1755-1758. Other materials include maps, warrants and miscellaneous papers such as a 1793 flyer for a play called "Wild Oats," an indenture for a female servant, and a 1784 letter written by Edward Hand regarding the Treaty of Paris. Items in Series 1 (*Land records*) are arranged as they were found, alphabetically by location. Items in Series 2 (*Miscellaneous*) are in the order in which they were found.
