

Armenian Genocide

- Herbert Welsh, founder of the Indian Rights Association, also took on other social causes, such as publicly calling for the support of Americans in the United States' efforts to help the Armenian people.
- 1915 marks the date associated with the massacre of Armenian populations living in the Turkish Ottoman Empire during the 19th and 20th centuries.
- Also in Philadelphia, the Knights of Vartan formed in 1916 as a fraternal organization honoring the heritage of Armenians.

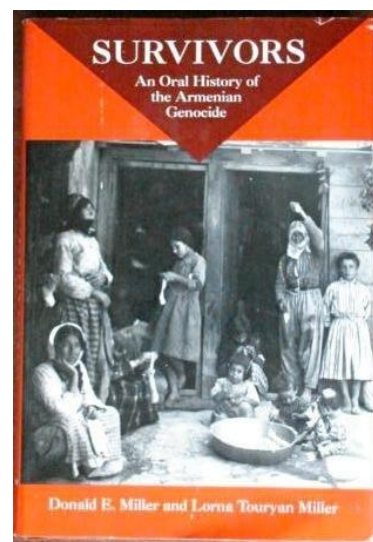

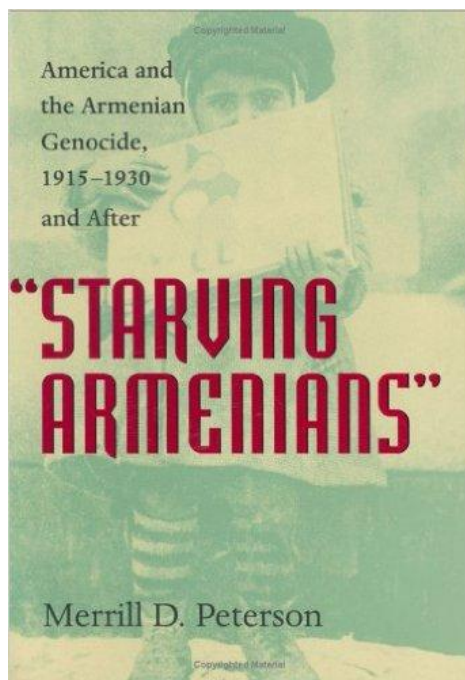
